


# Can you make the coolest coin creature?

Got some loose change lying around? Why not use it to make cool animal shapes? This is a fun way for your child to learn about money while being creative. Follow the steps below!

#### What Your Child Will Learn:







Sorting, counting, and adding coins

#### **Supplies You'll Need:**

- A handful of coins (No coins? Print and cut out the play coins included in this activity.)
- A flat surface to lay out the coins
- Printed activity sheets
- Something to write with (pencil, pen, or marker)
- Extra paper to keep playing!

#### What To Do:

- 1. Sort and Organize Coins: Use the sorting worksheet to help your child identify coins, determine their denomination, and sort them.
- 2. Make Your Animals: Use the coins and lay them out to cover the shape of the animals on the following page.
- 3. Count the Value: Add up how much your coin animals are worth and write it near your cool new creature.
- 4. Keep the lesson going! Have your child draw their own animals to cover and count!


