Supplies You'll Need:

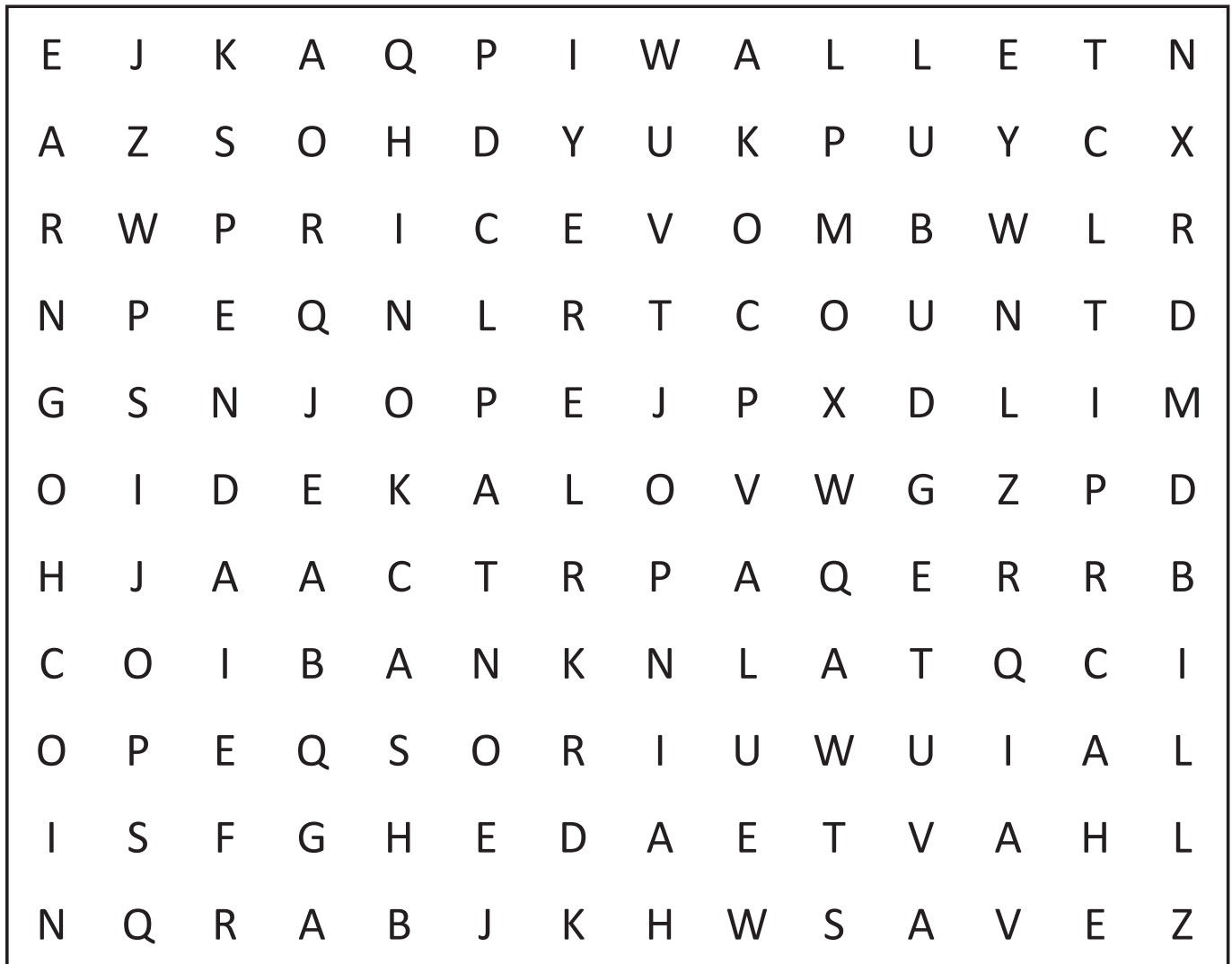
- A printed copy of this activity

Money Terms Word Search

Glossary of Terms



Bank: A bank is like a big piggy bank where people can keep their money safe. You can also get some money out when you need to buy things.



Bill: A bill is a piece of paper that tells you how much money you need to give to pay for something you or your family has used, like electricity.



Budget: A plan that helps you decide how much money you can use to buy different things like toys or snacks so you don't run out of money.



Cash: Cash is money that you can touch, like paper dollars and metal coins that you use to pay for things at the store.



Coin: A coin is a small piece of metal that is worth money, and you can use it to buy small things or save in your piggy bank.



Count: To count is to add up numbers or see how much of something you have, like when you count your toys or the coins in your piggy bank.



Earn: When you earn money, it means you worked hard doing chores or helping out, and then someone gives you money for your work.



Price: The price is how much money you need to give to buy something, like how many dollars it takes to get that toy robot at the store.



Save: To save money means you keep it and don't spend it right away, so later you can buy something big, like a bike or a new game.



Spend: When you spend money, you give it to someone else to get something you want now, like a toy or a piece of candy.



Value: Value is how important something is, like how a bottle of water is more valuable than a rock since you can drink water when you're thirsty.



Wallet: A wallet is a special pocket that can fold up where you can keep your money and cards safe when you carry them around.
